## New back yard burning by-law now in effect

Even though we live close to water, the new open air burning by-law still applies to us. Any type of fire must be located at least **6 metres from any building or structure** which is double the previous limit. Offenders can be fined and may be liable for other costs.

## Important Lake Meeting July 29th on Blue-Green Algae Threat

Anyone that is concerned about lake water quality should plan to attend this important meeting **Wednesday July 29th - 6:30 p.m. in the cavern at Science North**. Blue-green algae has been observed in a number of Sudbury lakes including Lake Ramsey.

Blue-Green Algae can be very **highly toxic** and has resulted in cases of severe illness and death (mostly animals) from drinking the infected water. Even coming into physical contact can be harmful.

It is obviously important that as Ramsey and Minnow Lake are connected that we know as much as possible about this threat and how to **guard against outbreaks** and what to do if we are affected.
